May this month be your own month of divine commendation as the Lord visits you...

We also can learn from the Christians of the past who at great cost to themselves declared this gospel and brought the nations to a sound knowledge of the Lord's mission and His goodness. One of them brought great joy to a city in Samaria. He subsequently assisted the first missionary to the African continent, by proclaiming Christ and complete dependence on the Holy Spirit. One outcome was that the first

Bibles were published in Ethiopia. And within only four centuries, the Roman civilization that nailed the Lord to the cross and fed his disciples to lions bowed to the Lordship of Christ. Alleluia.
